All goods manufactured and supplied by Gymleader New Zealand Limited are guaranteed for a period of 12 months from the date of purchase against faulty workmanship and materials when the product is used for the purpose for which is was designed.

Gymleader New Zealand Limited's obligations under this warranty are limited to the rectification or replacement of faulty parts only and Gymleader shall in no way be liable to the purchaser or user for any loss, damage (direct, indirect or consequential), cost or expense suffered or incurred by that person. The Warranty is Limited to "back to base" the purchaser will be responsible for getting the product back to Gymleader for repair should it be required.

Gymleader New Zealand Limited will not accept any liability for any consequential costs associated with the repair of defects and thee limits of liability shall be the original cost of the equipment supplied.

Normal wear and tear is not covered by the Warranty. Mechanical damage or damages caused by neglect, thermal shock, moisture or other causes outside the design capability of the system are excluded. Further this Warranty does not cover the failure or defects caused by the nature of the building construction, substrate faults, floods, fire or any other occurrences outside the control of Gymleader New Zealand Limited

The purchaser must notify Gymleader New Zealand Limited of any defects occurring during the Warranty period, in writing, within 7 days of the defect occurring.

If the purchaser choses to make modifications to any sport equipment, attempt to rectify the problem themselves or chose to send it to be fixed by a third party without notifying GymleaderNew Zealand, the Warranty will then be null and voided.

This warranty is issued in addition to any Rights under any appropriate Statutory Legislation.
